

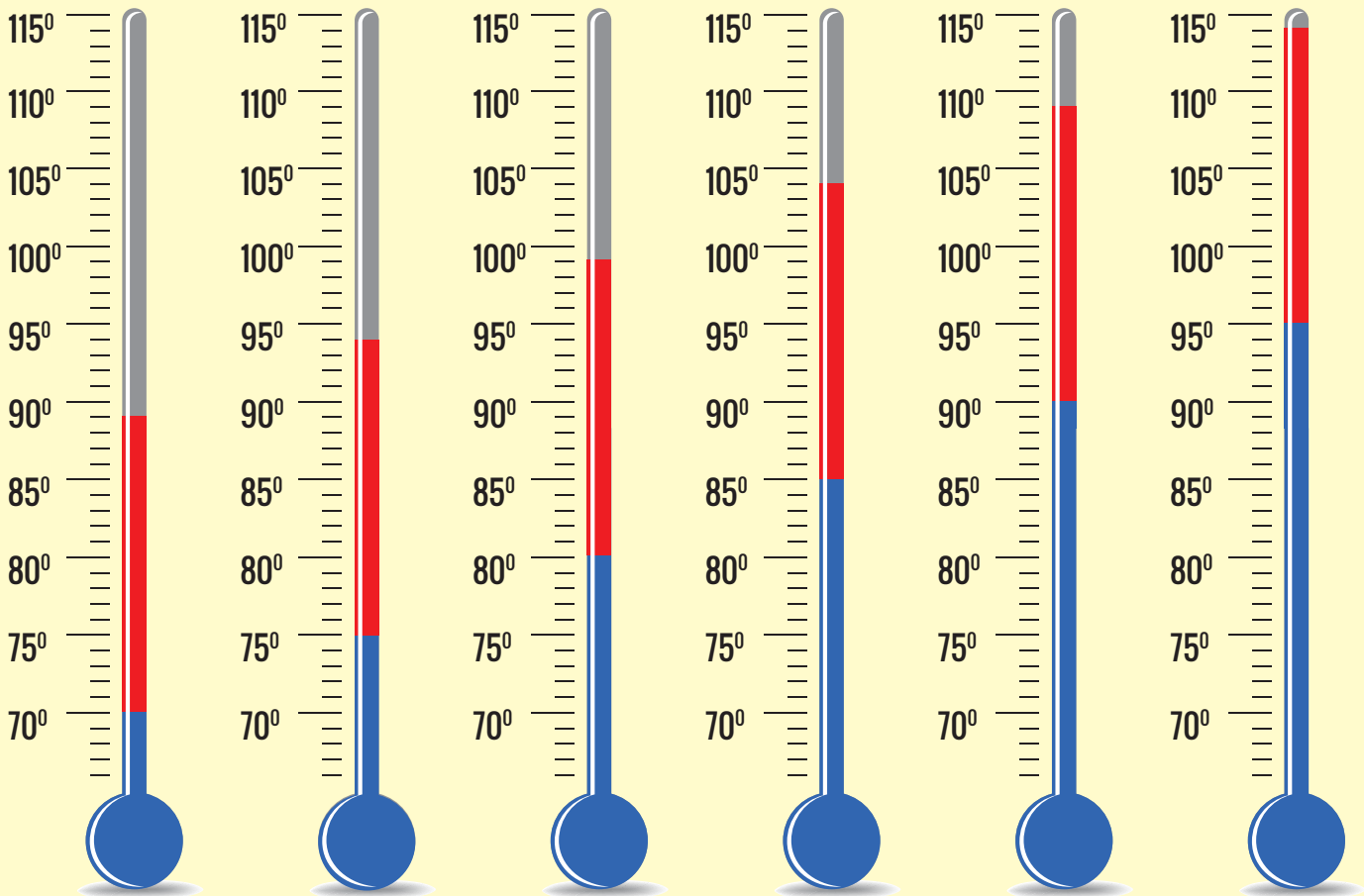


PET HEAT INDEX CHART

Keep your animals safe this summer. Never leave your pets in a parked car—even in the shade! **Not even for a few minutes.**

If you see an animal in immediate distress*, call the police, IMMEDIATELY. Report the make, model and color of the car, location and license number.

*Signs of distress could include: heavy panting, increased salivation, weakness, vomiting, diarrhea, bright red tongue, seizures, frantic behavior (trying to escape from car), whining, anxiousness, deep breathing, and/or confusion. If you see a dog suffering from heat stroke, get them to a veterinarian IMMEDIATELY.
